



CKI-Kiwanis Joint Fundraisers:

Work together to fund your club's service and administrative accounts

1. Donut sales (Krispy Kreme)

A Kiwanian or CKI member contacts a Krispy Kreme or other Donut store and works out a deal to buy donuts at \$3.50 (or less) per dozen, then the clubs sell the donuts at \$7 per dozen. Kiwanians and CKI members can take pre-orders to sell on the designated pickup day and pick the donuts up from the donut shop.

2. Football Stadium Cleanup

CKI club members can clean up stadiums after their school's home football games each year. The school will pay the club to clean the stadium.

3. Kiwanis Pancake Day

CKI members assist Kiwanis clubs at pancake days by selling tickets to the event and working the event (cooking, cleaning up, serving people, running errands)

4. Kiwanis Turkey Smoke

A Kiwanis club with a large barbeque meat smoker smokes community members' turkeys the days before thanksgiving for a fee. The CKI club can assist by publicizing the event ahead of time and taking orders at the event.

5. Kiwanis Takeover

Once a term or year, CKI club officers can "take over" and run a Kiwanis meeting. The CKI club can also hold a bake sale at the same time to raise extra money. The CKI organizer should speak with the Kiwanis club president at least one month in advance to decide on a date. As many CKI members as possible should attend.

6. Odd Jobs

CKI clubs can auction their members to Kiwanians to do yard work, babysitting, car detailing, secretarial

work or various other jobs at their homes or businesses. One example is detailing the Kiwanians cars while they are in their meeting.

7. Rose Sales

A CKI district (or club) can work with their district Kiwanis Foundation or with a local Kiwanis club to sell dozens of roses. The Kiwanian or CKI member in charge of the project contacts a rose wholesaler. Kiwanis clubs and CKI clubs sell dozens of roses for \$15 each. The money to cover the cost goes to the rose wholesaler, and the rest of the funds can go toward the CKI club or district and Kiwanis club or district. Kiwanians and CKI members can assemble boxes and roses in bouquets together. This will also work with Carnations under other holiday contexts (ex. Mother's Day)

8. Kiwanis Peanut Day

CKI clubs can coordinate a Kiwanis Peanut Day fundraiser with their Kiwanis club. More information is available through www.kiwanispeanutday.com

9. Rummage/Yard Sale

CKI members ask Kiwanians to clean out their closets and donate items to the club for a rummage/yard sale. A Kiwanian may also let the CKI club hold the sale in front of their business or house if it is at a good high-traffic location.

10. Date Auction

Auction CKI club members and members of other student organizations. Invite Kiwanians and involve them in the planning and publicity of the event.

11. Silent Auction

Have Kiwanis members donate items for a silent auction. Host the auction on campus or in a

community area, and invite Kiwanians and school community members to attend. Have notepads next to each item with a minimum bid listed. People may bid on the items by writing their name and price down. The bidding is closed at a certain time and the winners are announced.

12. Cow Bingo

The CKI or Kiwanis Club borrows a cow from someone who owns one and puts the cow on a football (or other large) field. Members divide the field in to sections, which people buy. Whatever square the cow poops on is the winner, and the owner will receive prizes or cash.

13. Spaghetti Dinner

CKI members set a location and date for the dinner, and get as many items donated as possible. Kiwanis members can help plan the menu, cook and serve. Kiwanians and CKI'ers can pre-sell tickets.

14. Murder Mystery Dinner

CKI and Kiwanians decide on the mystery, date and location. Recruit members (maybe theater majors) to be the actors. Kiwanis members can find a caterer or find a location with a stage. Both groups can advertise and sell tickets to the event.

15. Jeans to Work

CKI Club members can sell stickers that allow staff members at their college to wear jeans to work on a Friday. The club must get permission from department heads ahead of time. CKI members can also sell the stickers to Kiwanians, particularly if most of the Kiwanians work at the same place. In that case, contact the Kiwanians' boss ahead of time.

16. Concession Stands

Work a concession stand with Kiwanis at a campus or community sporting event or festival.

17. Holiday Sales

Sell something on campus and with your Kiwanis members for specific holidays—candy, flowers, wreaths, candles, cards, cookies.

18. Tournaments

CKI members can organize tournaments with Kiwanians. It could be for basketball, softball,

putt-putt, fishing, golf or almost anything.

Kiwanians and CKI members secure the area to have the tournament, prizes, trophies, t-shirts, food and other necessary. Both groups can publicize the event.

19. Human-I-Tees Groups can fundraise together through Human-I-Tees by selling shirts through the company.

20. Assist in other Kiwanis Fundraisers Whatever your sponsoring or other local Kiwanis clubs do to fundraise, do not hesitate to approach them and work out a way to assist the Kiwanis club and raise funds for your club by working together.
